Parish Council News

Residents raise regular concerns about parking, traffic and speeding in the village. Whilst the Parish Council has no direct power to address these issues, we are taking action and advocating where we can. As well as organising the Community Speed Watch (CSW) in the village for priority locations, we are:

- Encouraging Davidson's, MBC & LCC to progress the traffic calming proposals for Mill Hill as a condition of their planning permission.
- Have applied to have Mill Hill recorded as a location of Community Concern following feedback from the CSW and subsequent police camera van activity.
- ❖ Have requested the LCC's support with signage and possible redesignation of Moor Lane following its resurfacing.
- Have written to the school to remind them to encourage parents to park responsibly and to also use the visitor spaces on the Paddocks development as agreed.
- Have written to the garage to ask that they remind customers to park responsibly.



Memorial plaque lettering restoration and roof maintenance

We are delighted to say that the professional lettering restoration work on the WMI's facade memorial plaques and foundation stone has now taken place. The faded lettering was restored using War Memorials Trust advice hand-painted using a fine detail brush with an oil-based enamel paint, chosen for durability and long-term weather resistance, with a clay bar used to avoid paint bleeding. bleeding. Big thanks to Joan Bray's monthly Crafternoon group, who have once more decorated the WMI porch pillars with their beautiful red knitted poppies in readiness for the village Remembrance Services on Sunday 9th November at St Guthlac's Church and the War Memorial Institute .We have also recently had to replace fillets of cement, just under the roof tiles on the front right of the gable end, as they had started to crumble.

Next steps for the WMI Refurbishment

We have met with four local builders to talk through the plans, and all have suggested various constructive ways to help mitigate the impact of the works on the WMI's hirers and users, and on the busy Main Street. If the planning application is approved, the next stage will be to appoint an architect to produce the Building Regulations drawings. These will incorporate our decisions on heating, flooring and the kitchen layout etc following visits to other local halls and discussions with providers. Once the Building Regulations drawings are approved, the builders will provide quotations from them and we will have a target for fundraising! And then last, but certainly not least, whilst we can appoint our builder, their availability and our raising and coordinating sufficient funds to pay them in a timely manner is the next mountain to scale.

St Guthlac's November and December Services

Please note the changed times of some of the services for the run-up to Christmas. Evening services are now at 4:00 pm for the winter months, including our traditional candle-lit Carol Service on Sunday 21st December with the Vale Choir.

The Stathern WW1 and WW2 Remembrance Services – Sunday 9th November

Our Remembrance Services take the same form as in previous years, starting at the church at 10.15am followed by the Act of Remembrance at the War Memorial Institute at 10.45am. The address theme this year will be "The red poppy" and the wreath will be laid by a member of the Booth family. The collection will be for the Royal British Legion.

Our Harvest Festival charity was to ShelterBox (international disaster relief)

We thank all the children and parents from Stathern School for all their Harvest food gifts, which were displayed in the church for our Thanksgiving Service. These were taken to the Grantham Foodbank.

The collection at the service and the raffle collection at the Harvest Lunch in the WMI has been sent to the international disaster relief charity ShelterBox.

The total raised, including a contribution from the PCC was £300, thank you to all who contributed to this good cause.

Church chancel repairs and a tragic surprise discovery

Work started on the major internal repairs to the south wall of the chancel at the end of September. Scaffolding was erected and enclosed in polythene to attempt to keep most of the dust out of the rest of the church. All the plaster has been stripped off and the wall cracks examined. On recommendation from the church architect, to try to stop the movement of the chancel walls, various holes were drilled, inserted with rods with nuts at



each end and grouted up. A major crack was stitched with concrete lintels and other devices used in an attempt to stop the wall and plaster cracking further. The wall will then be coated in new lime plaster with an embedded steel mesh for strength. At the time of writing, the work was still proceeding.

When the workmen removed the old plaster, a small brass wall plaque to the Revd. Robert Pratt (died 1946) was temporarily removed. The workmen found a small box containing his ashes in a niche behind the plaque. Noone currently alive knew that it had been deposited there. It will be replaced with the plaque when the work is complete. The tragedy is that the Revd. Pratt was Instituted to the parish by the bishop on 11th May 1946 and he died just over 3 months later on 19th August, aged 60. Nellie Dyer, writing in her memoirs, said that he had caught scarlet fever the previous January and that he was a grand man.

New life for our embroidered church kneelers

These days, when people attend church, they rarely use kneelers. In the 1980s, 24 villagers each made an embroidered kneeler for the church, with all the patterns being different. Now, many of these have some deterioration due to a moth infestation, and the PCC wants to save the main face of each kneeler as a record of the work done for the benefit of the church. It is hoped that a group can take on the restoration of the embroidered patterns, join them together, and make a spectacular tapestry which can hang in the church or WMI.

The PCC invites interest in a proposed contract

The Parochial Church Council wishes to place a contract with a firm or person (preferably local) who can check and clear the church gutters, downpipes and hoppers on an annual basis and who holds public liability insurance. Some ladder-work will be involved - the church has commercial ladders. 

The Stathern Community Heritage Engagement Programme

<u>The October and November Community Archaeological Dig in Coombs</u> Meadow

By the time this article is read, the community dig will be well under way and it is hoped that many from the village will try their hand at excavating the area where it is believed Colonel Hacker's house, Hall, or farmstead stood. At the start of the dig, a wall foundation and lots of rubble were found, but is it part of a home, or an outbuilding, and what artefacts are there to help us identify it?

There is still time to investigate on Sundays from 9:30 am-3:00 pm, dependent on weather and progress. There will be updates on Stathern Chat. Later in the year, the Field Detectives will hold another meeting in the church to explain what they have found. We are so grateful for their commitment, enthusiasm and knowledge, which they are so willing to share with us.

Two lectern-type Information Panels for Stathern

Parish Council and Leicestershire and Rutland Wildlife Trust permissions have been granted for two information lecterns to be erected, one next to the Parish Council notice board on Main Street and the other in Coombs Meadow. The former is a brief historical account of Stathern, and the latter is in two parts, which introduces the Nature Reserve to visitors and tells the story of the regicide Colonel Francis Hacker and his residence close by.

The lecterns have been ordered and will be erected as soon as they have been delivered. The cost is covered by the Heritage Lottery Fund grant for community engagement, which was an obligation forming part of the church tower restoration grant.

New addition to our Stathern Heritage website

The latest addition to our stathernheritage.com website contains, under the section 'Places', details of the Stathern Church Chantry, the Chantry priest's house and the Dovecote. The house and dovecote were on the site where some Chapel Lane buildings now are. The website contains a photograph of the preserved and now hidden dovecot, and a view of a tiny medieval window, both of which are likely to be from the original medieval buildings.
